## CLIMAT

*The name Mazy was first used in 1420. Situated in the continuation of the Clos de Bèze, it is evident that the use of this climat for winemaking purposes has a long history. The Mazis are sited upon crinoidal limestone (limestone formed with fossils) dating from the lower Bajocian era, and calcareous rocks rise to the surface of this brown soil. Superbly protected from the north by the village, the Mazy-Chambertin is one of Gevrey’s subtlest and most complex grands crus.*
